Meetings...

At this month's meeting we will be discussing the 4H special event and making a few decisions on what it might look like.

Red Cross Radio Drill...

On May 30, The Red Cross teamed up with ARES Chapters to Activate Shelters in our area. The scenario for the event was:

"Sporadic power outages have occurred in numerous locations throughout the United States. This means no internet and no cell service in the affected areas. Red Cross is standing up shelters."



Thanks to intel, it was known two days in advance that an attack was coming so the Red Cross and ARES had been alerted.

Participating hams will set up at "Shelters" (not really, everyone will be at home), receive requests from Shelter Personnel to transmit 6409 etc RC forms interstate to a receiving station where there is power and internet."

Participants from the Warrick County ARES Group included: Dave Sandine (KC9UUVG), John Williamson (KD9KEG), Dennis Slow (KC9SFP), Ron Lile (K0RL), James McWhorter (KF4LXS), and Steve Connaughton (K9SRC).

The participants of the exercise exchanged multiple messages via WinLink. This drill was kept simple due to many of the operators involved not being accustomed to sending the messages.

Another drill is being planned for the fall of 2020. Prior to the event, training will be given on how to send and receive messages through the WinLink program. Several suggestions were made at the last meeting to help prepare for the next event. A few of the suggestions are:

- Set up a Warrick ARES Wellness Net for weekly checkins.
- Practice with using the forms in WinLink to become more familiar with them.
- Send messages with and without the use of a radio.
- Check into multiple Nets that are held on a weekly basis.

ARRL Field Day 2020...

Field Day this year was held on June 27th & 28th. The location was Boonville City Park. The Ohio Valley Amateur Radio Club hosted the event and invited the Warrick County ARES-RACES group to participate. There were a total of 6 ARES-RACES operators present during the event. Multiple pieces of equipment and processes were tested during the event. Some of the equipment tested included Go Boxes, Computers, Networking, Multiple types of Antennas, Tri-plexers (Coverage of 10,15, 20, 40, 80 meters on one antenna), Headset Adapters, PI Interfaces with Radios, Solar Charging Systems, and multiple types and brands of batteries.



The processes that were used for the first time at Field Day this year included Video/Audio Streaming via Twitch. Through the use of Twitch the club maintained open communications with persons throughout the US during the entire event. WinLink was also used during the event for the first time. Messages were sent to the ARRL Indiana Section Emergency Coordinator, Mayor Charlie Wyatt, Red Cross Rep, ARES Assistant Coordinator, and the Director of Warrick County EMA. The messages were sent via radio during the event. Reply messages were received from all persons but one.

The Field Day exercise allowed the operators to try new tools. These tools will give the ARES_RACES group more capabilities if they are called upon to set up communications during an emergency.

Newburgh Fireworks...



With everything being canceled, here is an event that is still happening. The Newburgh Fireworks are still taking place. Steve (K9SRC) has received the following from his contact and reached out to the Vanderburgh County Auxcom

"Last week we got the thumbs up from the police and fire departments to move forward with the planning of the event for September 5. Everything will be the same as other years, but the fireworks will be at approximately 8pm instead of 9pm since sunset is earlier in September than July."

"We are being asked to man the volunteer parking, turnaround (which I assume is the second parking area we did last year) and the security zone. This will require several people. I encourage you to mark this date on your calendar and make plans to work this event.

I've also reached out to Vanderburgh county Auxcom to request their help, making this a joint event. There is interest among their membership to be involved."

WinLink Net...

“Indiana Winlink Wednesday started in January this year so we just had our 26th session. Today we had 16 check-ins. The net works using Winlink. On Tuesday, a message is sent to your station regarding the check-in information that is requested on Wednesday. Then anytime on Wednesday 0000 thru 2359 local time, you send in the requested information. On Thursday, a confirmation message is sent out and you check into the website, <https://qsl.net/k9atp/IWW>. Mark K9ATP set up this website for Indiana Winlink Wednesday and runs the site. The site has only been up for a few weeks...

Anyway, sometimes the NCS asked for general check-ins, ICS-213 forms, weather snap shots....etc. The idea of the net is to use and get familiar with Winlink Express. We ask that all check ins leave your station over RF. We discourage the use of Telnet /Winlink because this defeats the purpose of the net. Of course, any licensed operator can check in any way they can. So using VHF or HF is acceptable.

The good thing about the Net is you have anytime on Wednesday to check-in.”
